# Have you experienced human trafficking or exploitation?

Being trafficked or exploited can have a long-term impact on you and affect many parts of your life. You may also find it difficult to adjust to living in a new country or place. But you are not alone. There is help for you to start recovering from your experiences and help you settle into your new life.

# COMPENSATION

If you have experienced trafficking and/or exploitation in the UK, you may have a right to financial compensation for injuries (physical and/or mental) you suffered when you were trafficked/exploited in the UK.

This loss includes physical or psychological injury. It can also include any financial loss you have suffered and future loss you will suffer because of the impact trafficking/ exploitation had on you. For example, you may have injuries that stop you from being able to return to work.

We know that no amount of money will make up for what you have suffered or lost; it is just society's way of recognising what happened to you. Compensation can also help you with recovering from your experiences.

There are different ways that you can seek compensation for what happened to you, depending on your circumstances.







#### **Criminal Injuries Compensation**

The Criminal Injuries Compensation Authority (CICA) is a UK Government fund for victims of violent crime. You can apply to CICA for financial compensation for the harm you experienced when you were trafficked/exploited in the UK.

There are conditions you have to meet in order to be eligible to apply to CICA. There is also a time limit for making an application to CICA. Therefore it is important that you get independent legal advice as soon as possible before you apply for compensation.

# OTHER COMPENSATION

### **Damages Claim**

You may be able to claim damages against the people who trafficked and/or exploited you. 'Damages' is the term used for a payment of money to compensate you for loss you have suffered because you were trafficked and/or exploited.

Depending on your circumstances, you may be able to take the person/people who trafficked and/or exploited you to court to ask for a sum of money to compensate you for the loss you experienced because of what they did to you.

There are time limits that apply for bringing a damages claim therefore it is very important that you get independent legal advice to find out about your options.

It is also important to know that a damages claim will not lead to any criminal conviction against the person/people who trafficked/exploited you.

#### **Employment Law**

You may have a case against your employer if they exploited you. For example, you may have a claim for unpaid wages; poor working conditions; discrimination. There are time limits that apply for making a claim therefore it is important that you get independent legal advice as soon as possible.

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## **LEGAL ADVICE**

If you need legal advice or information, it is important to find the right solicitor (lawyer) for your legal needs. This will depend on what sort of case you have.

If you cannot afford to pay for a solicitor, you may be eligible for legal aid. Legal aid is available regardless of your immigration status. Legal aid in Scotland is provided by the Scottish Legal Aid Board.
