'I remember breaking down and absolutely bawling my eyes out at school when I realised I would be paying around £50,000 a year for a Medicine degree.'

'Because I am an asylum seeker, I can't go to university. There are a lot of barriers to me such as not having access to SAAS funding and the lack of scholarships available.'

'I did very well at high school and got 7 A's at National 5 and 5 A's at Higher. I applied to SAAS for funding and they rejected me because of my immigration status.'

'While I did not choose to come to Scotland, I am choosing to stay. I want to work here in the NHS. I put down roots here, I went to high school here, my friends are here, I am building a life on my own terms here. So, it is heartbreaking that I am not treated the same as my peers who are doing the same.'
